MEETING STUDENT NEEDS THROUGH DISTANCE LEARNING

The Beauregard Parish school system is hosting an orientation for the Beauregard Virtual Program on Tuesday, August 8, 2017, at 1:00 p.m. in the computer lab at the Beauregard Alternative Building, 506 Martin Luther King Drive in DeRidder.

The Beauregard Virtual Program is an online program of study open to high school students enrolled in a Beauregard Parish public high school, according to Terrie Smith, BVP Coordinator.

This alternative learning environment is designed to meet the needs of students who want to pursue their education in part or entirely through distance learning. It offers a full curriculum to earn a Louisiana high school diploma. The program is provided tuition-free during the regular school year.

“The Beauregard Virtual Program offers original credit or credit recovery options for students on a full-time or part-time basis,” Smith explained.

“Students may need an alternative to the traditional classroom for many reasons,” she said. “The Beauregard Virtual Program can help meet the educational needs of students with medical or mobile issues, scheduling constraints, and other situations.”

Students register for the Beauregard Virtual Program through their district school site. Each student is assigned a certified Beauregard Parish teacher as an academic mentor who helps oversee the coursework completion. Course work is self-paced, and each student is responsible for his or her own progress.

“The Beauregard Virtual Program is an online learning environment with a rich network of local academic support providing an alternative to the traditional classroom,” concluded Smith. “We encourage anyone interested in learning more about the program to attend the orientation session on August 8 or to contact the guidance counselor at their district school site.”
